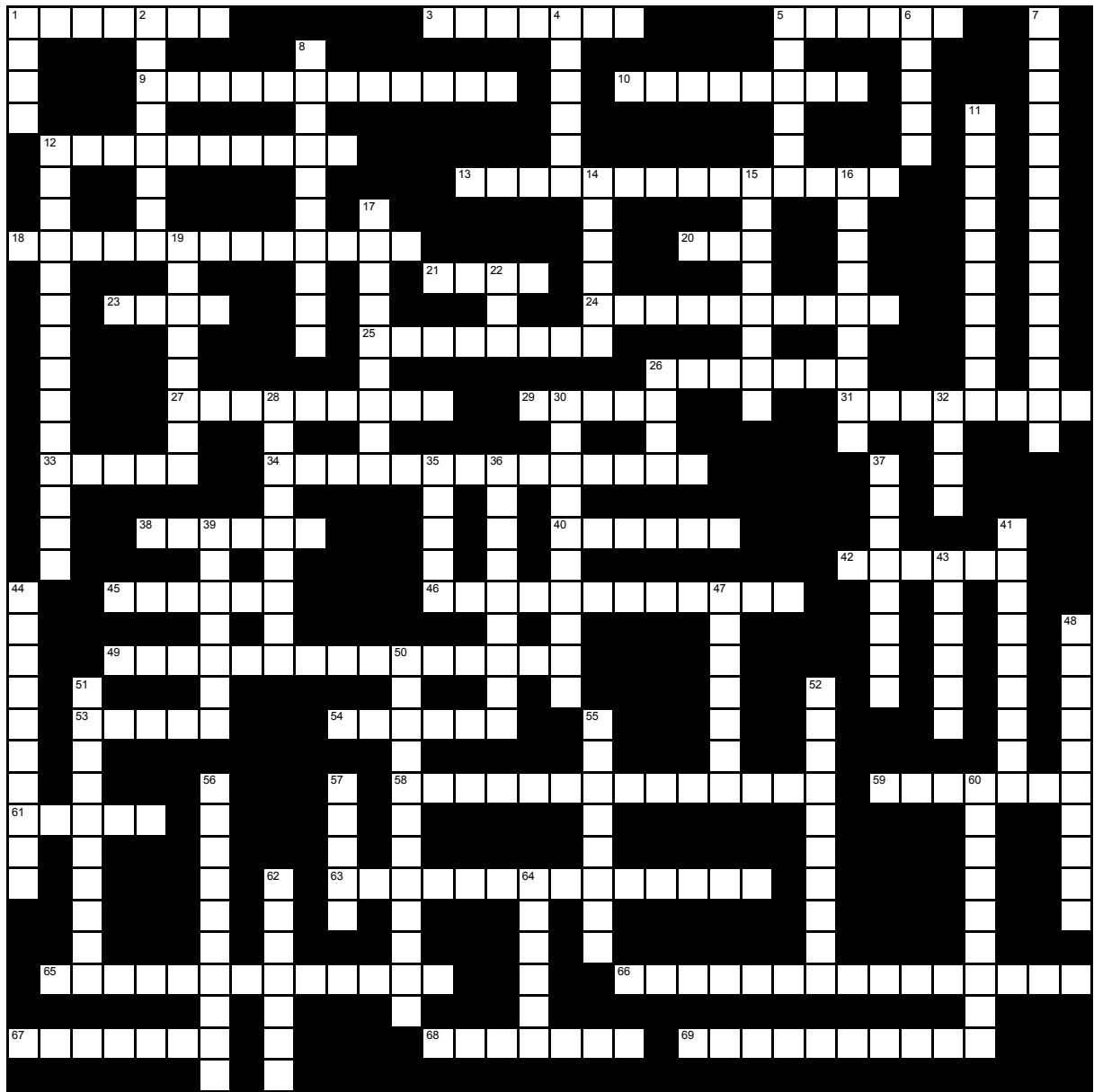

- 1 A term that literally means “bridge-builder.” It refers to the Bishop of Rome, or pope (7)
- 3 The \_\_\_\_ of Faith is the heritage of faith contained in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition (7)

- 1 He is both a symbol of the Church’s unity and her principal guarantor (4)

- 7 A false doctrine taught by John Calvin that God determines people for Salvation or damnation before they are born (14)
- 8 The \_\_\_\_ Reformation was an effort to reform the Catholic Church in the sixteenth century (10)
- 11 A Latin term that means "of his own accord." (4,6)
- 12 This heresy held that Christ possessed only a divine nature and that his human nature was absorbed into his divine nature (14)
- 14 A break in Christian unity that takes place when a group of Christians separates itself from the Church (6)
- 15 Worshiping something or someone other than the true God (8)
- 16 Greek: "mother of God" (9)
- 17 The name for participants in one of the nine armed expeditions by Christians beginning in 1095 (9)

- 47 Literally, "public work" or "service done on behalf of people" (7)
- 48 The commonly spoken language (10)
- 50 Episcopal \_\_\_\_ refers to all the bishops of the Church with the pope as their head (12)
- 51 Apostolic \_\_\_\_ refers to the careful selection of new bishops to carry on the faith and protects the Church from divisions (10)
- 52 The \_\_\_\_ Mass refers to the one codified way to celebrate the Mass established by the Council of Trent (10)
- 55 When a person is \_\_\_\_ into the Church, he or she is baptized into Christ's Body and shares this unity with the Father. (8)
