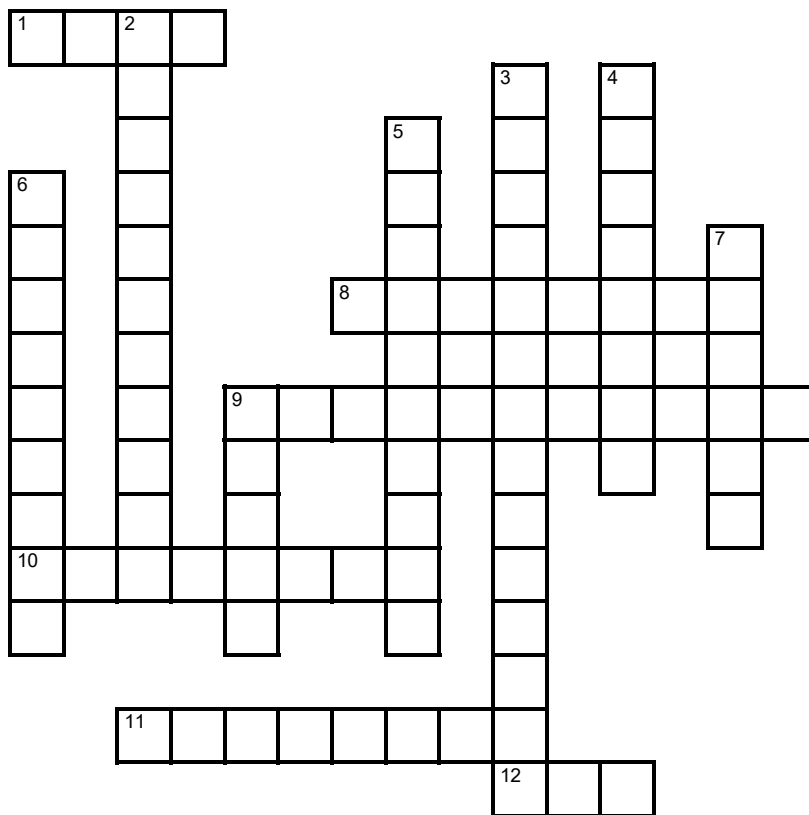
3 Refers to the study of Jesus Christ; the academic effort to understand who he is. (14)
