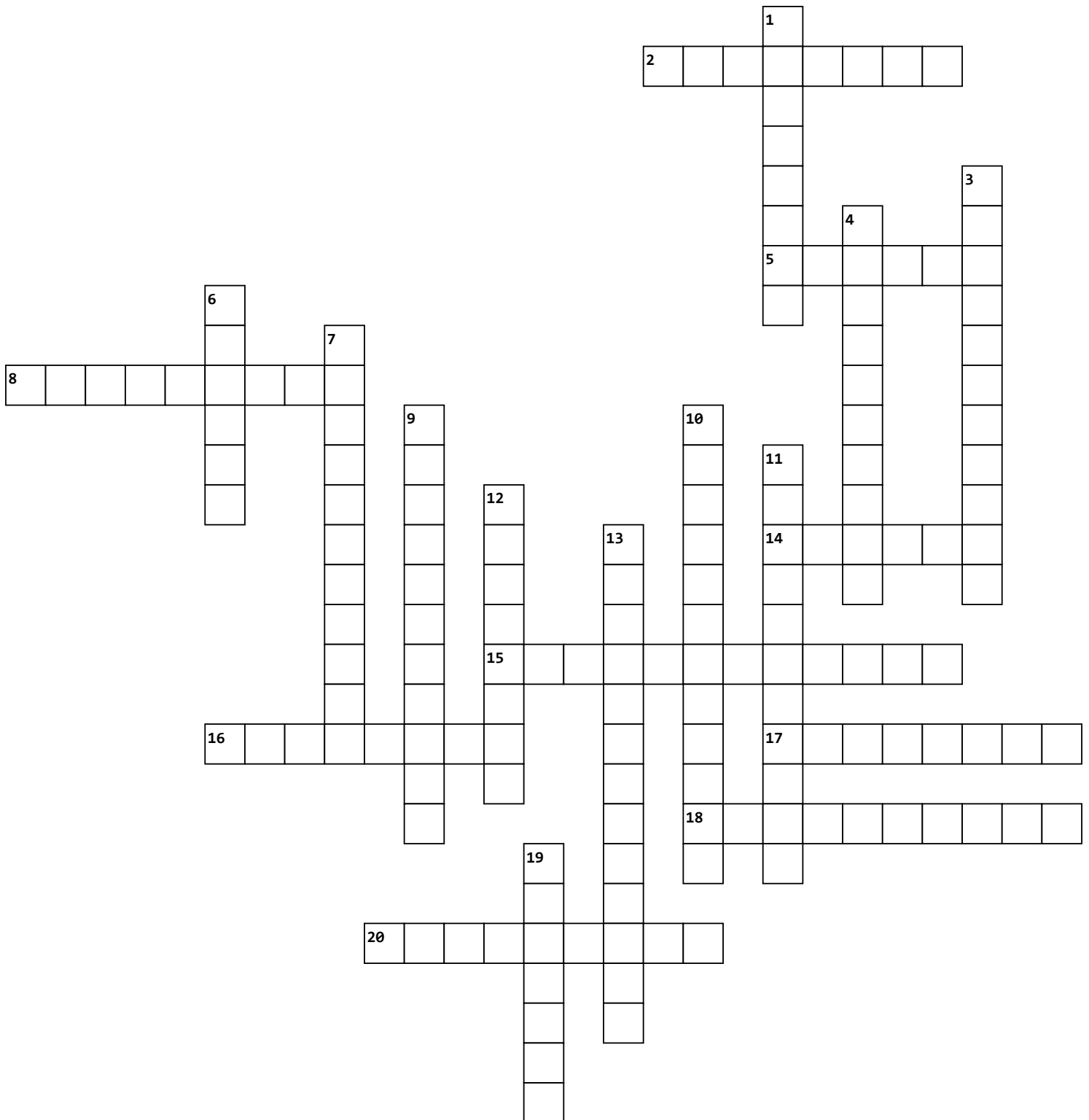


# God Saves Crossword Puzzle Chapter 6

**17.** A system of ideas in areas like politics, economics, and religion that forms a person's basic beliefs.

**18.** Heartfelt sorrow for sins committed, along with the intention of sinning no more. This most important act of penitents is necessary for receiving absolution in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

**20.** A form of prayer in which one glorifies God's greatness and in which one humbly acknowledges that God is the loving Creator of everything.

**4.** Latin for "magnifies," the term expresses the first words of the Canticle of Mary in Luke 1:46-55.

**6.** A small candle that is used to remember a prayer intention. Votive candles are common in many Catholic churches. Candles in a red-tinted candleholder are often placed near a statue of St. Joseph and candles in a blue-tinted candleholder are placed near a statue of Mary.

**7.** The remission before God of the temporal punishment still due to forgiven sins. These are, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "closely linked to the effects of the sacrament of Penance."

**9.** The priesthood of Christ, consisting of priests and bishops, received in the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Its purpose is to serve the common priesthood by building up and guiding the Church in the name of Christ

**10.** Also known as the Liturgy of the Hours, it is the public prayer of the Church, which makes holy the entire course of the day and night. In this prayer, Christ continues his priestly work through his priestly people.

**11.** Supernatural visions in which a person (or object) not accessible to human powers is seen and usually heard. \_\_\_\_\_ can be mistaken for illusions so the Church requires proof that they have occurred.

**12.** A liturgical formula or prayer of praise to the Blessed Trinity, from the Greek for "glory."

**13.** A gaze of faith on Jesus.

**19.** A book of psalms that are arranged for use in the liturgy. It contains many forms of prayer.
