**5** A term that describes a process of "education in the faith" for young people and adults with the view of making them disciples of Jesus Christ. (10)

**9** The name for one who proclaims in word and deed the Good News of Jesus Christ. (10)

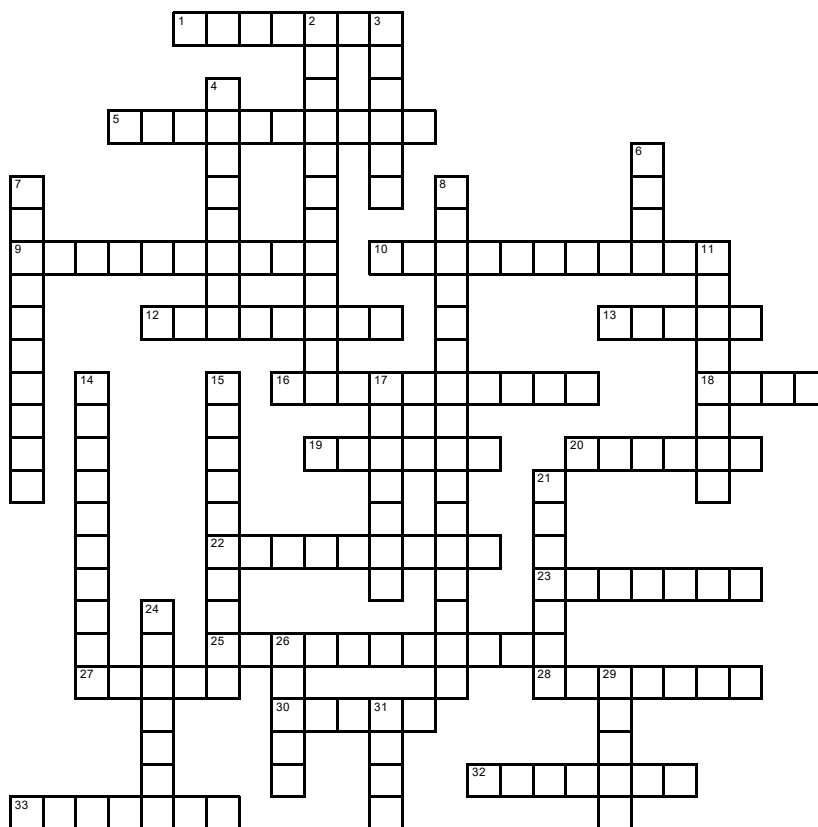
**10** Translation of the Vulgate into English by Bishop Richard Challoner. Used primarily by English-speaking Catholics before the 20<sup>th</sup> century. (5,6)

**12** Three epistles of the New Testament- the First and Second Letters to Timothy and the Letter to Titus- that are specifically addressed to individual pastors in the Church. (8)

**13** \_\_\_ Greek was the common language spoken in the Roman Empire of the first century. (5)

**16** The readings are gathered into the \_\_\_ and arranged around one of three annual cycles to be read at Mass. (10)

**18** \_\_\_ bridged the oral and written traditions of the New Testament and wrote the



oldest piece of writing in the New Testament. (4)

**19** \_\_\_ or literal translations of the Bible try to stick as close as possible to the wording in the original text. (6)

**20** Some books were deemed unacceptable to be included in the Biblical canon because of their heretical claims that they possess a "secret knowledge" (\_\_\_ in Greek) that guarantees a person's immortality. (6)

**22** Another word for covenant. (9)

**23** \_\_\_ equivalence is a type of biblical translation that focuses on forming and easy-to-read translation with proper English grammar and syntax. (7)

**25** A biblical \_\_\_ lists the occurrences of words in the Bible, from large words to small words. (11)

**27** A Hebrew term that, in the broadest sense, reflects the totality of God's Revelation.

However, it most commonly refers to the first five books of the Old Testament, also called the "Law" or, in Greek, the "Pentateuch." (5)

- 28 Characterized by the practice of severe discipline and abstinence for religious reasons. (7)
- 30 Recorded in order to preserve a permanent record of God's Word, to ensure consistency and unity, to be able to use it more easily for prayer and worship, and to prepare others for entrance into the faith. (5)
- 32 The heart of the New Testament and of the whole Bible because through them we can know Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and learn how to live as his disciples. (7)
- 33 St. Jerome's translation of the majority of the Bible from the original Hebrew into Latin. (7)

- 3 Ancient Jewish record keeper who was trained in the earliest forms of writing before literacy was widespread. (6)
- 4 St. Paul was known as "Apostle to the \_\_\_\_." (8)

- 7 Addressee of the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles; means "friend of God." (10)

- 11 Greek word meaning "one eye," used in reference to Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. (8)
- 14 Greek translation of the Old Testament. (10)
- 15 In Greek it means "five books." The term refers to the first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. (10)
- 17 The process in which the Hebrew translation of the Bible was translated orally into Aramaic around the first century AD. (7)
- 21 Scrolls that contained manuscripts from Hebrew Scriptures written in Hebrew and Aramaic originally discovered in Palestine. (7)
- 24 Greek word meaning "proclamation." (7)
- 26 A Catholic translation of the Bible that combines the literal and dynamic equivalence approach and is used for the Masses in the United States. (5)
- 29 The name for an ancient book that used papyrus or parchment stacked together and bound rather than strung together on a scroll. The term comes from a Latin word that means "trunk of a tree" or "block of wood." (5)
- 31 The \_\_\_\_ of the Old Testament mainly occur in the books of Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. (4)
