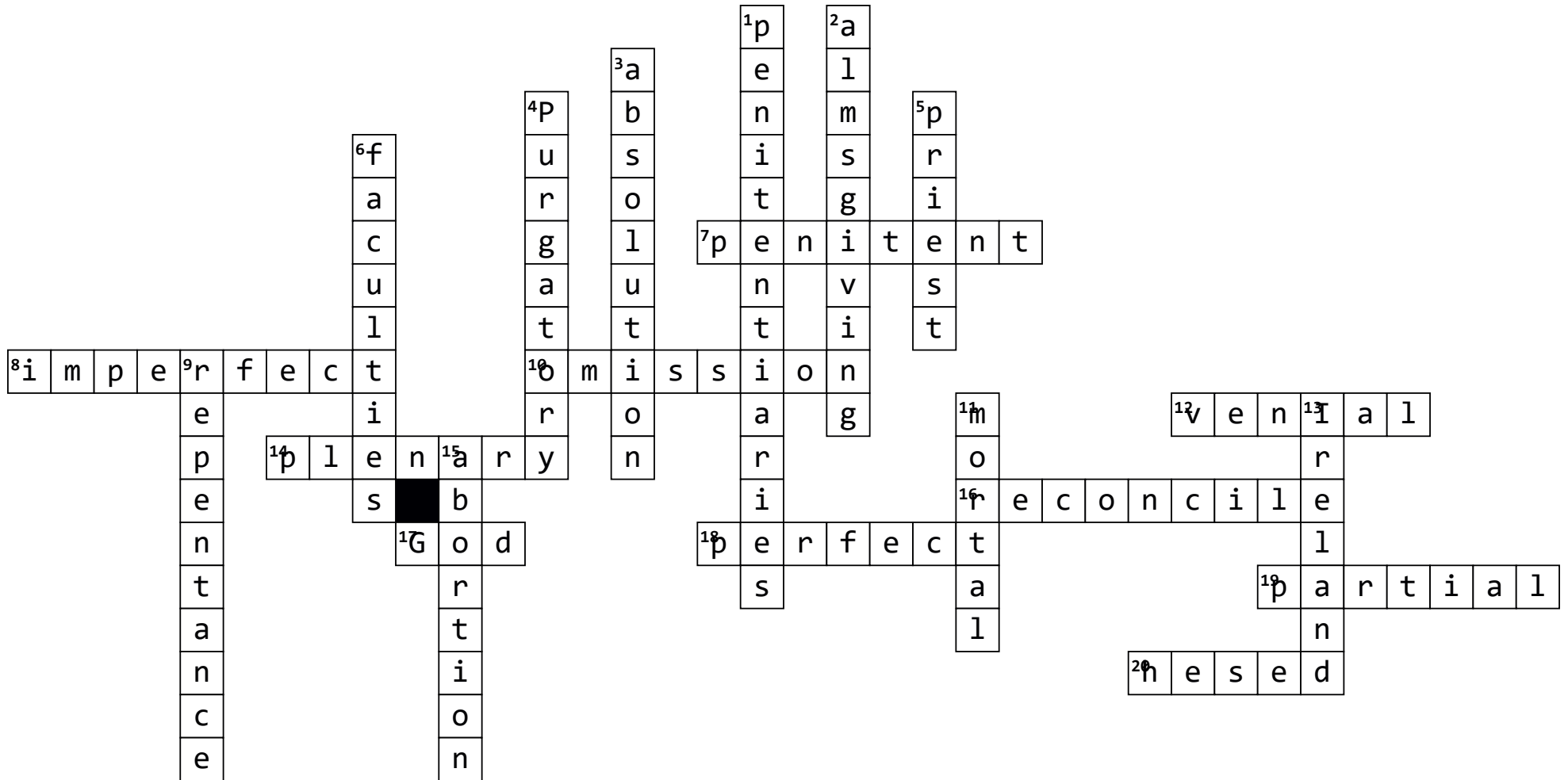


# Seven Sacraments Chapter 5 Crossword Puzzle
