## **JEDP Worksheet**

Biblical scholars theorize that the Torah was written by four distinct sources and that it is possible to recognize these sources through particular characteristics of particular biblical sections. If we know who is doing the writing of a section, we will also know their viewpoint and what they tried to emphasize about God in their writing which will aid us in interpreting the meaning of the passage.

*Yahwist* writers (J) prefer to use the name LORD or LORD God. They often portray God in very human terms, acting more human than divine. God is very close to his creation and people.

*Priestly* writers (P) prefer to use the name GOD when speaking of God. They portray God as far above his creation, giving commands, being an all-powerful God. They also like to list family trees (genealogies).

Elohists (E) make use of angels, visions, and dreams as ways God interacts with his people.

Deuteronomists (D) are the writers of the book of Deuteronomy.
