
Parallels between Moses, Elijah, and Jesus

Journeys forty years in the desert.	Journeys forty days and nights before reaching Mount Horeb.	Spends forty days and nights in the desert after his baptism.
Is fed by God with quail and manna.	Is fed by a raven and by an angel.	Is fed by God's angels at the end of his desert temptations.

Main Themes of the Prophets

Prophet	Main Theme
Elijah	 promoted worship of the one, true God opposed worship of Baal and challenged pagans to prove the power of their gods
Elisha	 like Elijah, asserted incompatibility of paganism and Yahweh worship challenged the king and political institutions to live morally
Amos	 an unrelenting prophet of judgment and doom preached repentance questioned materialistic lifestyle that depended on the poverty of others
Hosea	 portrayed God as loving, compassionate, and forgiving preached the need for repentance of sins used human love as metaphor to teach about God's compassion and forgiveness
