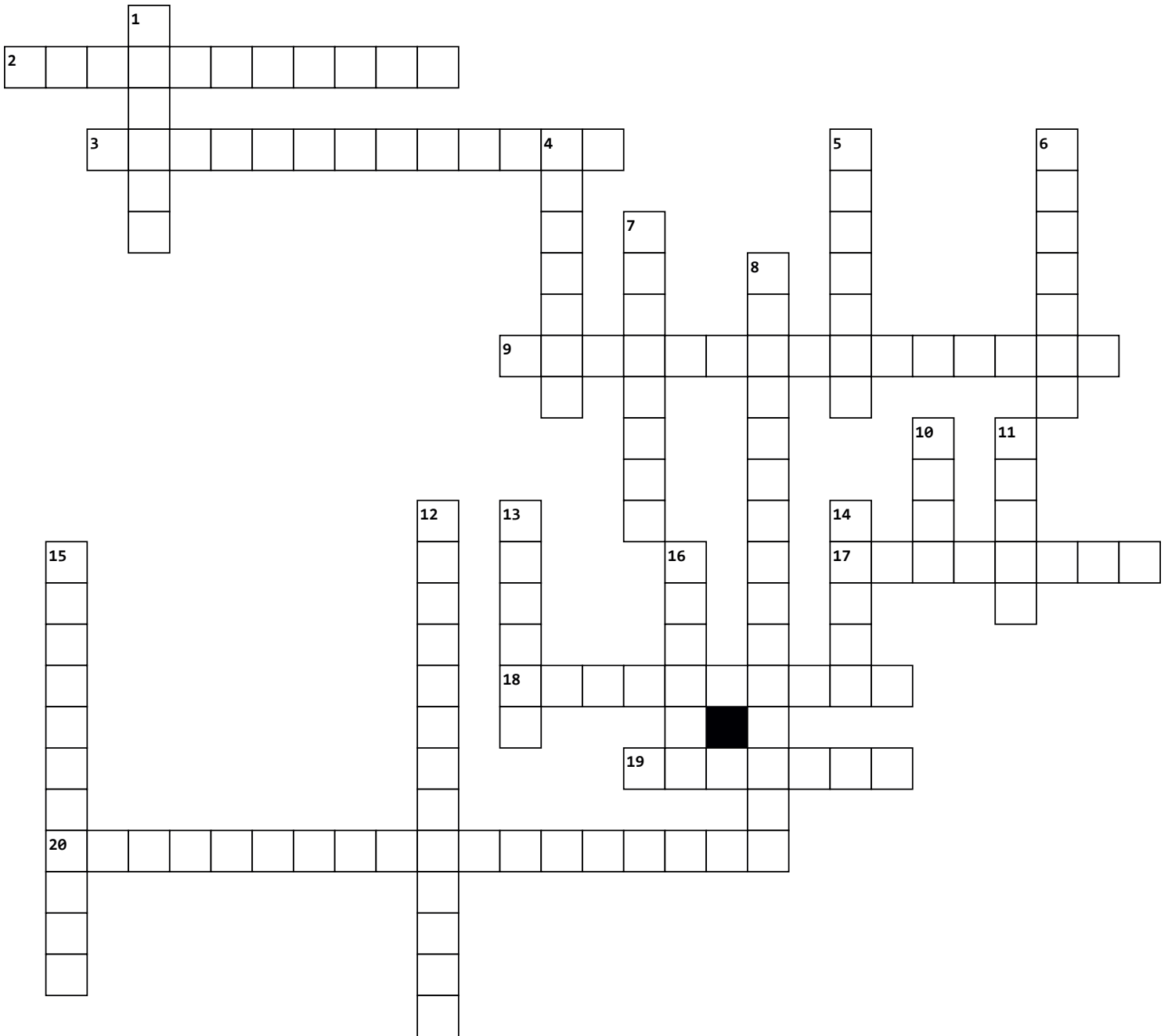


# Holy Catholic Church Crossword Puzzle
