- Eats scroll
- Priest in exile
- Valley of dry bones
- Spirit of God leaves Jerusalem
- Models city of Jerusalem

Daniel

- Book written under Antiochus IV
- Faithful to YHWH in the court of the Persian kings
- The lion’s den
- Apocalyptic visions
- Interprets Nebuchadnezzar’s dream
- Shedrach, Meshach, and Abednego

Hosea

- Gomer
- Children named “not my people” and “she is not loved”
- A harlot wife and harlot’s children
- Criticizes Jehu

Joel

- The “day of the Lord”
- Battle in Valley of Jehoshaphat
- Links to Pentecost
- “Rend your hearts, not your garments”

Amos

- Condemns greed and gluttony
- “Lying on beds of Ivory”
- Shepherd and tree farmer
- “Prophet of doom”

Jonah

- Prophet to Nineveh
- Swallowed by a large fish
- Runs away from his call
- Angry at God’s mercy
