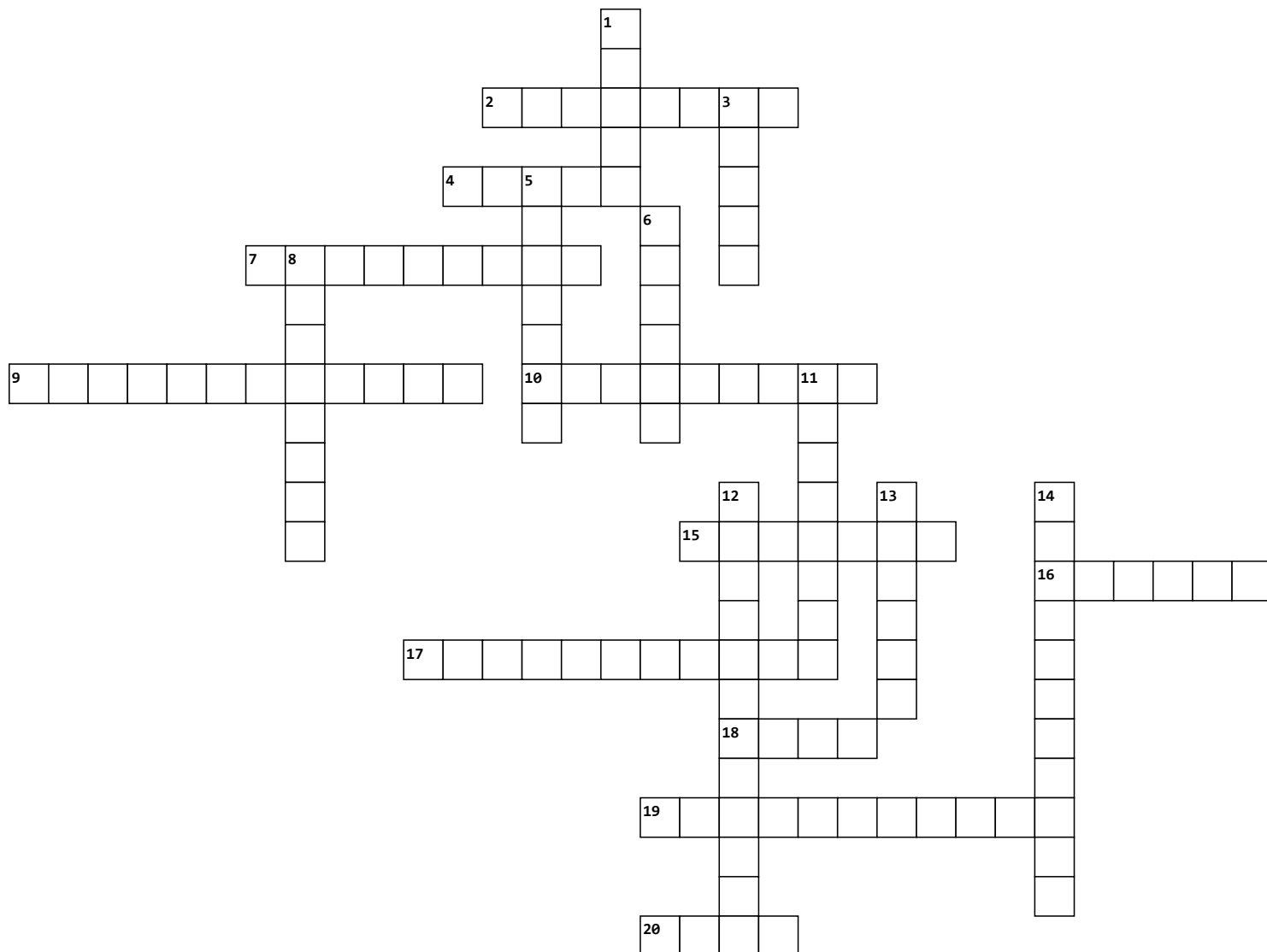


Catholic Morality Crossword Puzzle Chapter 8
